### Child First Initiative Coordinator

Under the supervision of the Manager, Inuit Programs and Services, the Inuit Child First Initiative (CFI) ensures all Inuit children have access to the essential government funded health, social and educational products, services and supports they need. The CFI Coordinator is responsible for the identification, acquisition, and coordination of services for children and families who require services in accordance with the Inuit specific Child First Initiative funded by the Department of Indigenous Services Canada. With minimal direction from the Inuit Programs and Services Manager, the incumbent works to ensure culturally relevant, safe, and equitable access to services and to identify service gaps and mobilize resolutions, procurement, and communications.

#### Key duties and responsibilities

The CFI will manage individual and group case files, perform data collection and reporting; prepare and document the needs and services for children who are in need; assist families to complete and submit applications for funding; meet with service providers and other stakeholders to ensure children's needs are met; work collaboratively with KIA staff and external agencies and other organizations to ensure that all financial claims related to CFI are processed and managed according to KIA policy and procedures; provide information sessions/community forums on CFI; analyze and identify gaps related to children's needs and services; promote, support, and maintain effective working relations with the Kivalliq Region; actively participate in staff meetings, training events, planning, and working groups and other KIA initiatives.
